For the sixth year, Unali'Yi Lodge is offering the service award, which all members can complete. The purpose of this award is to increase: membership retention, brotherhood conversions, and service to scouting and in your communities. We had around 50 brothers earn this award in its inaugural year, and they were presented with their certificate and service flap at the recognition banquet at Fall Fellowship. If you want to increase your cheerful service, then make sure to complete this award. The requirements can be found on the Lodge website at site236.com and in the trading post at Camp HNW. These are the requirements:

Unali'Yi Lodge Service Award Progress Tracker

- 1. Registered and in good standing in the BSA, Coastal Carolina Council, and Unali'Yi Lodge
- 2. Have the current Lodge dues paid

3. Complete the requirements below. Bolded items are required. In addition to the bolded items, one of the non bolded items must be completed as well.

- Attain the honor of Brotherhood (if eligible)
- Attend 75% of Lodge Functions in one calendar year
- Join and be active in a committee on the Lodge Executive Committee
- Have a total of 10 service hours outside of Lodge sponsored events
- Help someone from your unit or chapter attain the rank of brotherhood OR get someone who has not been active in the Lodge (has not paid dues for a year or missed 2+ consecutive functions) to attend a Lodge Function
- Serve as a member of your chapter's unit election team and participate in running one unit election
- Attend a Cornerstone Conclave
- Staff at CCC Cub Haunted

The Patch Thread

In honor of our founder, J. Rucker Newbery, 2 runs of memorial flaps were made in 1979 (s13) and 1980 (s14). The first run of flaps quickly sold out, so the lodge ordered a second run of them. These came with a different style border and thus we had two different issues of what was supposed to be the same patch. The S13 had a cut edge border and the S14 had a rolled edge border This is the only flap in our collection with feathers along the bottom edges.

Another set was later made to be more modernized.
